Definition: "God did NOT call us to UNCLEANNESS, but in HOLINESS" – What is meant by "uncleanness"? There are a lot of "modern" terms that we use for certain sexual behaviors, such as masturbation, homosexual, heterosexual, pedophile, pornography, etc., which are not in the Bible. The reason they are not mentioned in the Bible **by those names** is because those are modern, recently-made-up terms, and they were not in use in the English language when the Bible was translated. Masturbation, pornography any other sexual sins would be **included under the category of "uncleanness" and sexual impurity**. This includes the area of **keeping our thoughts pure**, because there are most likely sensual, impure thoughts going through a person's mind before they ever do the physical act. We need to be careful what we look at, listen to, and think about, so that our thought life is pure. Jesus says, in Matthew 5:28, that **looking at another person in a lustful way is already committing the sin of adultery**. All uncleanness whatsoever, whether adultery, fornication, or any other sort of uncleanness are works of darkness. God's word, in Ephesians 5:11-12, says "it is a shame even to speak of the things that are done by many people in secret." **All these things are contrary to PURITY in heart (thoughts), speech, and behavior, and therefore are contrary to that HOLINESS which the Lord desires for us, and even commands.**

Definition: “Whatever things are TRUE, whatever things are NOBLE, whatever things are PURE” – All this list of qualities includes things that are mentioned in the FRUIT of the SPIRIT, and in the LOVE chapter of I Corinthians 13, and the list of character qualities II Peter 1:5-8 says that we need to develop in our lives. Obviously, as Christians, we should be reading and meditating on God’s word, but we should also be careful of the other things we put in front of our eyes, or hear with our ears, as **NEGATIVE things will influence us in a harmful way.**

Definition: “BROTHERLY LOVE” – There are three kinds of love mentioned in the Bible: sensual, sexual love (the Greek word is *eros*), brotherly love (the Greek word is *phileo*), also called “brotherly kindness” in Second Peter 1:5-8, and God’s kind of love (the Greek word is *agape*). **God’s kind of love is sacrificial and giving, not selfish.** The Holy Spirit gives us the love of God in

our hearts.

Definition: "You yourselves are TAUGHT by GOD to LOVE one ANOTHER" – If we read the
gospels and learn about the life of Jesus, we will see **how He LOVED everyone**, and we are told to
follow His example. This is how we are "taught by God" - by reading and studying His word, and
following the example of Jesus. But again, **we can't LOVE others with God's love unless we are
empowered by the Holy Spirit. Jesus said this LOVE would flow out of us, like streams of
living water**, when the Holy Spirit comes to dwell in us and we are allowing Him to take control of our
lives.

Definition: “WALK properly toward those who are OUTSIDE” – “Those on the outside” refers to non-believers, since they are “outside” of the church and kingdom of God. Jesus, in His earthly ministry, often spoke in parables, and He told His disciples what the parables meant, but those who heard Him and didn’t understand were those who were not really interested in following Christ anyway. To **“walk properly” before non-believers means that our life and witness to them must be Christlike and godly in our dealings with them.**

When we are living our lives in front of non-believers, **we need to consider the consequences of our words and actions**, as to whether they reflect Jesus Christ or our own character defects and shortcomings.
