Definition: "Every man who becomes CIRCUMCISED is a debtor to KEEP the WHOLE LAW" - Circumcision was the outward sign of the fact that the Israelites had a covenant with God. **Jesus brought in the New Covenant**, and the sign of circumcision for the Old Covenant was now obsolete. As Christians under **the New Covenant, we have two "outward signs" of our covenant with God: (1.) water baptism and (2.) the Lord's Supper (communion)**, and we do not need the outward sign of circumcision that belonged to the Jews or nation of Israel. What these people who were following the Judaizers didn't realize is that **if you're going to take one or two things from the Mosaic Law and say that Christians have to obey them, then you're going to have to keep the entire law!** The Law of Moses, with the commandments on the tablets of stone, was not even in existence from the time of Adam and Eve, and on through all the early patriarchs such as Enoch, Noah, Job, Abraham, and Isaac. **The word of God tells us that "the law was four hundred and thirty years" AFTER the time of the COVENANT of FAITH that God made with Abraham.** God made a "covenant of faith" with Adam, with Noah, and with Abraham, and all the other people who believed God in their times, completely apart from the laws God gave to Moses and the people of Israel. We need to have this perspective, because then it is not so strange to think that **God would supercede the law of Moses and the covenant He had with Israel with a NEW and BETTER covenant. The Law of Moses, with its sign of circumcision, was in EFFECT for God's people during a CERTAIN TIME, and under CERTAIN CONDITIONS, namely UNTIL the MESSIAH (Christ) SHOULD COME.** The New Covenant went into effect when Jesus died on the cross to pay the penalty our sins, and when He rose from the dead for our justification.

Definition: "You have FALLEN from GRACE" - Some people use this expression to say that a person can lose their salvation and "fall from grace." But if you read this carefully, you see that Paul is saying that if they are going to try to "be justified by the law"; **they "have FALLEN from GRACE."** If you are going to put yourself back under the law of Moses, you must accept the death penalty and "curse" for not keeping the law. **The law was an unbearable BONDAGE** that no one could keep, and the penalty for breaking the law was usually to be stoned to death. That's not GRACE! **Grace is God giving us what we don't deserve. We are in Christ, and Christ has made us free from the curse of the law!**

Definition: "I do NOT SET ASIDE the GRACE of God" - If you mix in the works of the law (trying to keep the Old Testament commandments), or try to ADD ANYTHING to Christ's work on the cross, you are **"SETTING ASIDE the GRACE of God,"** because you have ADDED your WORKS. The very meaning of GRACE is that it is **UNMERITED (you don't deserve it) and UNEARNED (you can't work for it) FAVOR - being ACCEPTED and LOVED by God** when we have done NOTHING and

CAN DO NOTHING to EARN or DESERVE it. We are saved by **God's GRACE** through our **FAITH**, and NOT by our works or by keeping the Old Testament Law.

Definition: "Eagerly wait for the HOPE of RIGHTEOUSNESS by FAITH" - We are made righteous in Christ the moment we believe in Him and are saved, but the "hope of righteousness" is our waiting for the time when it is fulfilled in our lives (sanctification). **In other words, God sees me as righteous in Christ, but I DON'T always ACT righteous. What we are waiting for is the "hope" of a life where we LIVE and ACT in complete righteousness, just like Jesus.** That will come as we grow in Christ and allow the Holy Spirit to "sanctify" us (make us holy in our conduct). Ultimately, our complete sanctification will occur **when we receive our resurrection bodies.** The Rapture of the Church, when God catches up of all Believers in Christ and we receive our resurrection bodies, is also called **"The BLESSED HOPE."**

Definition: "REDEMPTION of our BODY" - When we receive our RESURRECTION BODY. Our SPIRIT within us is BORN AGAIN and made NEW, but we feel "naked" without the corresponding NEW SPIRITUAL BODY. (See **Genesis 3:9-11** and **I Cor. 15:35-57**)

Definition: "IF there had been a LAW given which COULD have GIVEN LIFE, RIGHTEOUSNESS would have been by the LAW" - The Law of Moses could not make a person righteous, or give them eternal life. I heard J. Vernon McGee say that no one was saved by the law during the time the Law of Moses was in effect. They were still saved by grace, through their FAITH, but as it were, saved on credit. Just as if you bought something with a credit card, the bill would finally come due, and **SOMEONE would have to PAY for it. Jesus Christ PAID for the SINS of the Old Testament Believers when He died on the cross, just as he paid for our sins. By FAITH in GOD, as they kept the law given to them (and NO ONE could keep it perfectly) and BELIEVED in the COMING Messiah, the Old Testament Jews were putting their salvation on hold, or on credit, until Christ would come and cry out from the cross, "It is finished - PAID IN FULL!"**

Definition: "IT IS FINISHED!" - The Greek word is "**Tetelestai**" which means **literally, PAID IN FULL**. It is the same word that would be used when someone paid a bill or **paid off a debt of any kind - PAID in FULL**. Just before Jesus cried out, "It is finished!" He cried, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" This cry was a fulfillment of Psalm 22, and what it means is that Christ at that moment was experiencing the abandonment and despair that resulted from **the outpouring of God's WRATH on Him as our SIN-bearer**. Jesus had become sin for the whole world, and God cannot look on sin! **Jesus PAID our SIN DEBT** as He hung and suffered on that cross, and God's wrath was poured out on Him instead of on us. When it was finished, He said "Paid in full!"
