Philippians 4:1- 7 Lesson #9

1-3 Therefore, my beloved and longed for brethren, my joy and crown, so **STAND FAST in the Lord**, beloved. I implore (beg) Euodia and I implore Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord. And I urge you also, true companion, **HELP these WOMEN who LABORED with me in the GOSPEL**, with Clement also, and the rest of my fellow workers, **whose NAMES are in the BOOK of LIFE**.

Definition: “STAND FAST in the Lord” – The word FAST here does NOT mean speedy, but it means to be **FIRM and stay in one place**, as in FASTENED. Paul is exhorting, encouraging, and maybe even **WARNING the Believers to NOT drift away from their faith in Christ**, or grow WEAK in FAITH.

• **Hebrews 2:1** “Therefore we must give the most _____ heed (pay attention) to the _____ we have _____, lest we _____.”

Definition: “HELP these WOMEN who LABORED with me in the GOSPEL” – The church in Philippi basically started with WOMEN. Paul went to a place by the river where some WOMEN met to pray. They were believers in the God of the Bible, but they did not yet know about Jesus. Paul preached Jesus to them, and they believed, and the church began in the house of Lydia. These women, Euodia and Syntyche, may have been some of those first women who believed, but they were having some disagreements between themselves. **Paul begged them to be in HARMONY in the Lord**. Paul had many faithful Believers who traveled with him in his missionary journeys, both MEN and WOMEN, and other WOMEN who served faithfully in each of the churches.

Definition: “Whose NAMES are in the BOOK of LIFE” – Who are the ones who get their **names recorded in the Book of Life**? Well, first of all, let us look at what the Book of Life is. The Bible says that the ones who are thrown into hell are those who are **NOT written in the Book of Life**, and whose book is it? Revelation 21:27 calls it **“The Lamb’s Book of Life”**, which means it belongs to **Jesus, the Lamb of God**. If you are a **believer in Jesus Christ**, you need have **NO FEAR of the Judgment**, because **Jesus has already PAID for your SINS**. He took our sins upon Himself, so that WE will not be punished for them, and **BECAUSE we BELIEVE in Him, our NAMES are WRITTEN in HIS BOOK**. People **who do NOT know Jesus** must stand before God at the Final Judgment and PAY for their OWN SINS!! Romans 6:23 says “the wages of sin is death” (the “second death” in the Lake of Fire, Rev. 20:14). The non-believers who are judged by God at the Great White Throne will be judged by their WORKS, which will NOT be good enough to save them. God has **recorded EVERYTHING that they have done, in the OTHER books** that were opened. Whatever “good works” they may have done, they will NOT be good enough, because God’s requirement is for us to be as perfect and righteous as Jesus, and that can only happen when a person **ACCEPTS Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior**.

Definition: “Giving thanks ALWAYS for ALL THINGS” — If you do not TRUST God to be WORKING ALL THINGS together for your GOOD (Romans 8:28), then you WON’T BE ABLE to REJOICE and give Him thanks for EVERYTHING that is happening or has happened in your life. As Paul and Silas were

locked up in the stocks, **having been falsely arrested and severely beaten**, they had several choices: to whine, complain, have a “pity party” or be angry and blame God, or **praise God and trust Him for the outcome**. Which one did they choose? You probably remember, but just in case, it’s in Acts 16:22-35, and **they chose to praise God in spite of their circumstances**. It resulted in their miraculous escape, and resulted in the jailer, his family, and many others being saved and coming into the kingdom of God.

•**Romans 8:28** “And we know that _____ things _____ together for _____ to those who _____ God, to those who are the _____ according to His _____.”

Definition: “REJOICE in the Lord ALWAYS” – To REJOICE and give thanks to God is the OPPOSITE of grumbling and complaining. REJOICING is also sort of a COMBINATION of the PRAYER of PRAISE, **JOYFUL WORSHIP** and SINGING. **Praise is also one of the WEAPONS** we use against Satan and his demons: **speaking the word of God out loud** (the sword of the Spirit) and the **PRAYER of praise and worship** (Eph. 6:18). The Psalms are an excellent source of scriptural ways to PRAISE and WORSHIP the Lord. Compare **Psalms 8:2 and Matthew 21:16** - Jesus Himself tells us here that praise is a weapon against the enemy. **Satan HATES to hear you REJOICE and PRAISE God**, whether you **SING it or just SAY it**, so don’t worry if you can’t carry a tune. God’s power is unleashed on our behalf as we praise Him, because He actually inhabits our praises! (see also II Chronicles 20:12-23)

5-7 **Let your GENTLENESS be KNOWN to all men.** The Lord is at hand. **Be ANXIOUS for NOTHING**, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and **the PEACE of God**, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.”

•**Matthew 5:16** “Let your _____ so _____ before _____, that they may _____ your _____ and _____ your _____ in heaven.”

Definition: “Let your GENTLENESS be KNOWN to all men” – Some versions say “moderation” instead of gentleness, but the meaning really **includes ALL of the FRUIT of the Holy Spirit, of which GENTLENESS is one of the fruits.** When Jesus said to “Let your LIGHT so SHINE before MEN” it is the same as **“Let your GENTLENESS be KNOWN to all men.”** This is also what Jesus meant by **our lives producing fruit that will glorify God the Father.** “By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit” (John 15:8).

Definition: “Be ANXIOUS for NOTHING” – What does it mean to be ANXIOUS? It means to be WORRIED, AFRAID, and NOT trusting God. So, this verse says we must NOT be anxious, AFRAID, or WORRIED for ANYTHING (be anxious for NOTHING). **You do NOT need to be afraid, because God is your loving Heavenly Father** – He REALLY DOES want to supply your needs, and He DOES have your best interests in mind. Even when He allows trials and tests to come into your life, it is always for your good.

Definition: “The PEACE of God, which SURPASSES all UNDERSTANDING” – This means we can have God’s peace in our lives, even in the most upsetting situations or uncertain circumstances. Normally, we would be WORRIED and ANXIOUS, but **Jesus said “in ME you may have PEACE.” If we are trusting Jesus completely, He will give us that PEACE that others, and even we ourselves, do not understand.** You may have people say to you, “How can you be calm and not worried when all this stuff is happening in your life?” Jesus said that **you CAN have PEACE** in the midst of tribulation (John 16:33) simply because you TRUST in Him. When He says that **He has “overcome the world,”** part of the meaning in the original Greek is “I have deprived it of power to harm you.” **The storm may be raging all around you, but you are SAFE in Jesus.** He has deprived that situation of whatever harm it might have done you, and **He promises that He will work ALL things together for your GOOD** (Rom. 8:28). However, you will not **experience His PEACE** until you BELIEVE it, and start thanking Him for EVERYTHING and PRAISING Him in all situations.
