**Definition:** "What she had KEPT BACK after she had been SATISFIED" – This was over and above what Ruth had gleaned - this was part of her lunch that she saved for Naomi. Ruth was not selfish in just eating enough for herself, but was thinking of Naomi as well.

20-22 Then Naomi said to her daughter-in-law, "Blessed be he of the Lord, who has not forsaken His kindness to the living and the dead!" And Naomi said to her, "The man is a RELATIVE of ours, one of our NEAR KINSMEN." Then Ruth the Moabitess said, "He also said to me, 'You shall stay close by my young men until they have finished all my harvest.'" And Naomi said to Ruth her daughter-in-law, "It is good, my daughter, that you go out with his young women, and that people do not meet you in any other field." So she stayed close by the young women of Boaz, to glean until the end of barley harvest and wheat harvest; and she dwelt with her mother-in-law.  • Deuteronomy 25:5-6 "If brothers dwell together, and one of them be married to a stranger outside the family; her brother shall go in to her, take her as his, and perform the duty of a husband's brother to her.  And it shall be that the firstborn which she bears will to the to the, that his name may not be blotted out of Israel."
Definition: "The man is a RELATIVE of ours, one of our NEAR KINSMEN" — Usually a brother, (but we are only told that Boaz was "a close relative" of Ruth's deceased husband) would marry his brother's widow, and her first son born of this marriage would carry the name of the dead husband. The Sadducees tested Jesus with a hypothetical story of seven brothers who each married the widow after each brother died, because they did not believe in a resurrection of life after death.
