Twelve Step Program

We enlist the "12 Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous" because we believe they work, and because the originators first trusted in Jesus Christ as their Higher Power. We believe these steps were given to mankind that we may heal and aid in the healing of others. This healing is free to all who seek it, but it will take honesty and commitment to defeat the enemy. The word of God will be our text, Jesus Christ our foundation, and the Holy Spirit our motivator, strength and power. We seek to reach out to anyone who is willing to try to better their lives and become better equipped for service to the Lord and our fellow man.

Monthly Evangelistic Outreach to Venice Beach

Saturday, July 3, 2021 - There was no outreach in July, because Dottie was out of commission with a broken arm.

We had been hearing for weeks that the L.A. County Sheriffs were Saturday, August 7, 2021 herding all the homeless people off the beach and Boardwalk, so we didn't know what we would find down there. We had 178 lunches, lots of socks, toiletry/hygiene packets, used clothing, shoes, and some blankets and pillows to give to the homeless. Felipe showed up early, just getting off a night shift at work, and he took some lunches to give out in his neighborhood, which is the Hollywood area. We figured that would be okay, since we expected to find fewer homeless people at the beach, and we know there are plenty in Hollywood. The other two groups, who went to Venice Beach, were composed of: me, Shami, Johnny, Victor, Sheldon, Michael and Kaela. Tom stayed home to keep us covered in prayer. There were indeed fewer homeless people down at the beach, but we managed to give out almost all of the lunches there. The few we had left over, we gave out in another area, a few blocks from the beach, where homeless still had their tents set up, and they were thankful to get a lunch. Each lunch contains a bottle of water, a small can of Vienna sausages, a fruit cup, some crackers, granola bars and cookies, and most importantly, a gospel tract, so we were also ministering the gospel of Jesus Christ to each person. One woman was barefooted, and she was so happy to get a pair of sandals, and she put them on right then and there. Another woman saw a bright colored shirt and said, "This is just perfect for me!" We had pairs of long pants, jeans, and some shorts, and guite a few T-shirts, all of which were gladly taken by the homeless people we found. We did find Jean, the lady who lives in her van, and gave her a lunch, some socks, and a large-print "Our Daily Bread", which she really appreciates, because she's 85 years old and needs the large print. Johnny and Kaela were approached by a man who asked if he could pray for them.

He said he went by the nickname of "J-Man", and he also asked where they went to church. They told him, and he actually showed up for our worship service at Sonrise Church on Sunday. He said he is a 68-year-old Vietnam war veteran, and we all welcomed him to church, and hope he will come again. After handing out everything to the homeless, we all continued down the Boardwalk giving out gospel tracts. Michael was recognized by a couple who knew him from his ministry that he does on Sundays at the Boardwalk. He and Eugene, another brother from the Bible Tabernacle, have a spot where they set up a table and do street witnessing and give out Bibles every Sunday afternoon.

Saturday, September 4, 2021 - Praise the Lord! Today was the day for our monthly outreach to Venice Beach. Besides Tom and me, the people who came to help us were: Johnny, Jacob, Kaela, Felipe, Victor, Jose, Sheldon, and Michael. Felipe and Jose came by on Friday and picked up the lunches they would be giving out to the homeless. Because of Felipe's work schedule, he said he couldn't come on Saturday, but we told him he could give out the lunches to the homeless in Hollywood, which is near where he lives. He brought with him Jose, who has come on the outreach with us before. Both Felipe and Jose, and also Victor, were doing our 12-Step program and Bible studies in prison, and they have been out for several years now. Last month, there were so few homeless down at the Boardwalk, we had lunches left over, so this is why we let Felipe and Jose give them out in a different area. The L. A. County Sheriffs had been moving all the homeless off the Boardwalk for the summer season. All our groups together gave out 180 lunches, lots of socks, toiletry/hygiene packets, used clothing, and a few blankets to the homeless. and Kaela said everyone was very grateful to receive the lunches and clothing. Victor said one woman almost cried when he gave her a lunch, she was so thankful. Sheldon said one man came up to him and just started talking, but when he saw Sheldon handing out lunches, he asked for one for himself, too. Sheldon said one woman got a lunch and some clothing, but then she asked if we had any women's underwear. We didn't at that time, but when we went back to the car to get more lunches and clothing, he saw some, and saved a pair for her. She was so thankful to get them. We had lots of T-shirts, which are always a favorite. One big guy asked if we had any T-shirts in a large size. and I found one in a triple X, and he was so happy, he gave me a big hug. One man who took a blanket said he needed it because the nights were getting colder. Next month, we will have more blankets and warm jackets to give out, too.. We gave a lunch to a man who plays the guitar down there almost every time we go, and I said to him, "We see you here all the time, but I don't know your name." He said his name is Dale, and he usually sings Johnny Cash songs, and sounds very much like him. We handed out guite a few gospel tracts to people who were just down at the beach, and each lunch we give to the homeless also contains a gospel tract. All in all, we had a great time down at the Venice Boardwalk, and we give God all the glory!

Prison Ministry

The total number of inmates doing our 12-Step program and Bible studies is around 350-400. We have women in the women's prisons: Central California Women's Facility in Chowchilla, and California Institution for Women in Corona. We have men in the men's prisons: San Quentin,

Soledad State Prison, Salinas Valley State Prison, Avenal State Prison, Solano State Prison, California Medical Facility State Prison in Vacaville, CA, California Correctional Institution in Tehachapi, Calif. Men's Colony in San Luis Obispo, Kern Valley State Prison, Chuckawalla Valley and Ironwood State Prisons in Blythe, CA, High Desert State Prison in Susanville, L.A. County State Prison in Lancaster, Mule Creek State Prison in Ione, Centinela State Prison in Imperial, Pleasant Valley State Prison in Coalinga, Chino State Prison, Calipatria State Prison, RJ Donovan State Prison in San Diego, two prisons in Corcoran, Calif., Folsom State Prison and CSP Sacramento in Represa, CA, Pelican Bay State Prison in Crescent City, and Sierra Conservation Center in Jamestown, CA. We have men in two new prisons, which are: Calif. Health Care Facility in Stockton, CA, and CAC in California City, CA. We also have a few inmates scattered across the country in Federal prisons.
